Climate change is a direct driver – but it also intensifies and exacerbates all of the other drivers

Key findings – issues

- **Nature** and its vital contributions to people, which together embody biodiversity and ecosystem functions and services, are **deteriorating worldwide**.
- **Direct and indirect drivers** of change have **accelerated** during the past 50 years.
- Goals for conserving and sustainably using nature and achieving sustainability cannot be met by current trajectories, and goals for 2030 and beyond may only be achieved through transformative changes across economic, social, political and technological factors.

Scotland

- Net zero by 2050
- 95% by 2040
- 70% by 2030
- = 6-8% p.a. from 2020
- 2009-2019 c. 3% p.a.
- More than twice the effort to date
- From organisation by organisation and sector by sector to
 - **Collaborative and place-based**

Net Zero The UK's contribution to stopping global warming

- Existing policies and technologies
 but ramped up
- Doubling of electricity demand (transport and heat)
- 20% of agricultural land for carbon sequestration (woodland, peatland restoration, bioenergy with CCS)
- Food waste and healthier diets (less red meat and dairy)

The response – common purpose

- On climate change much more behavior change
- Reduce Land Use Emissions and increase sequestration though closer to nature land uses
 - mitigation + adaptation + state of nature
 - A nature-rich future is our best insurance against the climate emergency.
