We regularly share events and opportunities organised by our strategic partners.

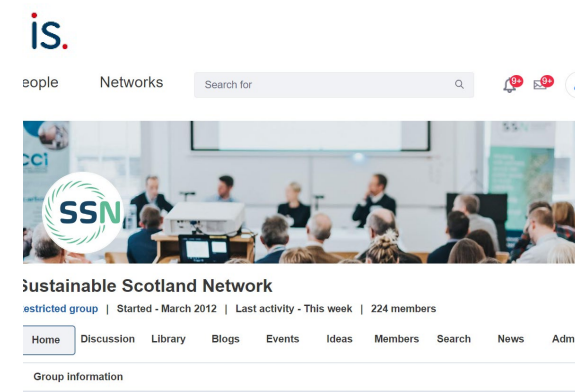

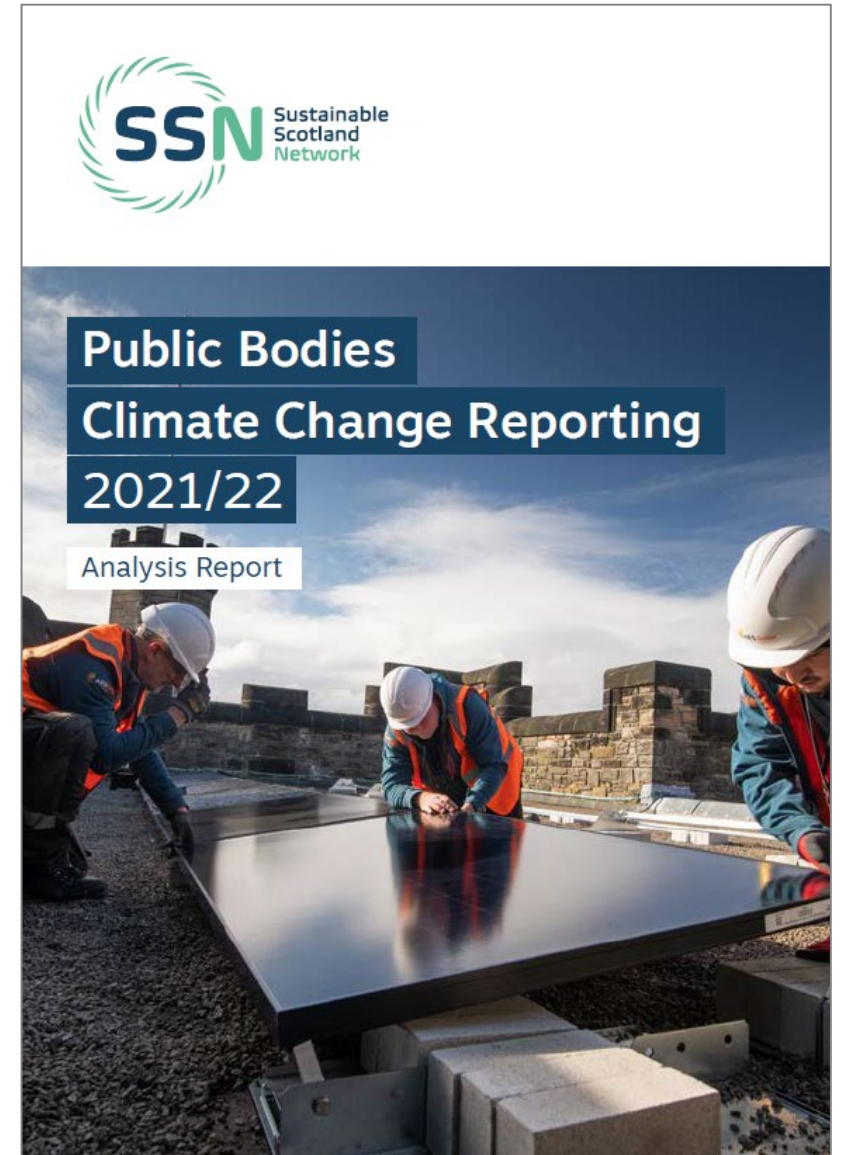
# Are you responsible for your organisations Public Bodies Climate Change Reporting?
